It is comprised of 21 Grade II listed almshouses, a chapel and gardens and the aim of St Oswald's Hospital is to provide high quality homes in a safe, secure and friendly environment, with a strong sense of community. Each of the almshouses is self-contained and consists of a living room, a bedroom, a kitchen and a bathroom and there are currently spaces available for new residents.

The SOPHIA Course: A Christian Eco-Spirituality Journey

The Sophia Course is a one-year journey of spiritual formation with a focus on creation-attuned spirituality. It is for anyone seeking to explore and grow in Christian discipleship in a world facing unprecedented environmental challenges.

The course will be delivered over six day-long sessions at Worcester Cathedral, which is an award-winning centre for Green training and education, covering spirituality, lifestyle, and campaigning (2024 Church Times Green Church Awards). The training days aim to engage body, soul, and spirit, blending more theoretical and more practical teaching with hands-on activities, social time, and contemplative prayer. (The six Saturdays are: 15 March, 17 May, 19 July, 20 September, 15 November, 17 January.)

5.30 pm Sung Eucharist for the Feast of St Oswald (with incense)

Oswald was a Dane who came to Worcester in 961, when St Dunstan made him Bishop. He set up a Benedictine community of monks to serve the Cathedral and in 972, also became Archbishop of York. Oswald was able to build a new Cathedral that was dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary in 983. Noted for his support of scholarly learning and church reform, Oswald died on 29 February 992 in the act of washing the feet of the poor and was hailed as a saint. His shrine in the Cathedral became a place of pilgrimage.
