Worcester Saints: 16 October

On Wednesday the Church remembers Hugh Latimer—a Leicestershire man, educated at Cambridge, articulate and yet homely in his style of preaching,

which made him very popular in the university, and he received its commission to preach anywhere in England. He became a close adviser of King Henry VIII after the latter's rift with the papacy and was appointed Bishop of Worcester in 1535. He lost the king's favour in 1540, over his refusal to sign Henry's 'Six Articles', designed to prevent the spread of Reformation doctrines, and resigned his See. He returned to favour on the accession of Edward VI but was imprisoned in the Tower of London when Queen Mary ascended the throne in 1553. He refused to recant any of his avowedly reformist views and was burnt at the stake, together with Nicholas Ridley, on this day in 1555. (Extract from *Exciting Holiness.*)

Jazz Evensong

Worcester Cathedral Youth Choir will be joining with singers from Dyson Perrins Church of England Academy, and young jazz instrumentalists from across the county, to sing a Jazz Evensong in the Cathedral on Saturday 19 October at 5.30 pm. All are welcome to attend this service, which takes the usual form of Evensong but with the music in a variety of jazz styles. The service will include compositions and arrangements by Will Todd, Hugh Morris (Director of the Royal School of Church Music) and Piers Connor Kennedy (former choral scholar and lay clerk of Worcester Cathedral, who is shortly to join the King's Singers).

Funeral

The funeral of Jocelyn Howells will take place at 1.15 pm on Thursday 24 October at St Paul's Church, Bedford, followed by interment at St Dunstan's Church, Bolnhurst. A requiem eucharist may be held here in Worcester at a later date. Jocelyn was a longstanding member of our cathedral community from the days of the old 9.30 am Sunday service onwards, particularly active in connection with Junior Church, weekly Prayers for Healing, and as a Steward. She was conspicuously good at spotting and befriending new worshippers.

There will be a sung eucharist for All Saints' Day at 7.30 pm on Friday 1 November, and a requiem eucharist for All Souls' Day at 5.30 pm on Saturday 2 November. All are most welcome.
