There will be an evening session on Tuesday 12 November from 7.30 pm to 9 pm and an afternoon session on Wednesday 13 November from 2 pm to 3.30 pm, and you are invited to sign up to attend one of these sessions, both of which will be held in the Great Hall of the Old Palace. Refreshments will be served on arrival, then the Dean will introduce the meeting. We will sit in small groups around tables and each group will have a set of questions to use as discussion starters, eg. What was the first death that you can remember? or How easy is it to talk to your family about your funeral wishes? Nobody will be forced to join in, although we hope that you will. At the end there will be a chance to ask for a further one-to-one talk if you have more questions.
