Praying for the Cathedral Community

Prayers at the Candlestand

When they are in the Cathedral, some people like to light a candle and place it on the candlestand as a form of prayer. This may be to remember someone who has died, either recently on an anniversary of their death or birthday, but it can also be to offer thanks for something good or to pray for someone who is sick or another request. After lighting the candle, some people also write their prayer request in a book that is next to the candlestand. They may just write the person's first name or give more detail. Once a week a member of the Pastoral Care Group takes a photo of the pages of prayers that have been written that week and distributes these around other members of the Pastoral Care Group who have promised to pray the prayers that have been requested. Whether you are accustomed to lighting a candle and writing a prayer request, or you would like to do so for the first time, it may be encouraging to know that your prayers will also be prayed by a member of the Pastoral Care Group.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4.6.
